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Canada and New England 11 DAY Cruise & Tour

DAY 1: Fly to Montreal, Quebec

Board your flight this morning to the beautiful city of Montreal in Quebec, Canada. Enjoy 3 nights in this French-speaking city on the St. Lawrence River, exploring lovely cafes and some of the more notable sites; Mount Royal Park and Notre Dame Basilica, a splendid example of English Gothic Revival architecture, Olympic Stadium, Expo 67 sites and Montreal Underground.

DAY 2 - 3: Explore Montreal

Enjoy a highlight tour of Montreal's best known sights with a local guide. The remainder of your time is own your own to explore! If you're hungry, perhaps visit St. Viateur Bagel Factory (the birthplace of the bagel), Jean Talon Market, the Jewish Quarter for famous smoked meat delis, or the Francophone district — for Quebeckers favorite junk food, poutine. Explore Old Montreal and visit the exact site where French settlers first set foot on the island. Try a horse-drawn carriage ride around the cobblestone streets and grand buildings of Vieux-Montréal to get a taste of European flavor.

DAY 4: St. Lawrence River Cruising

Today, join your group transfer to the cruise pier where you'll embark on your Canada/New England cruise aboard the Amsterdam. Begin your journey up the St. Lawrence river while settling into your cabin. The nearly 750-mile stretch of the St. Lawrence River is a lighthouse lover's paradise, with more than 40 of them lining the Québec portion alone. Centuries-old fishing villages line the mighty waterway that alternates between imposing cliffs and plateaus and broad estuaries filled with fertile islets. (B,D)

DAY 5: Québec City

Few places in North America are as steeped in history as Québec City, Canada. Older than Jamestown and founded before the Pilgrims landed at Plymouth Rock, it is the only city north of Mexico whose original fortifications remain intact. The Québec City historic district, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, is still home to religious orders and hospitals that date back to the 17th century. Its Place-Royale would look familiar to the explorer Samuel de Champlain, even with its modern attractions of gift shops and cafés. On the Plains of Abraham, you can walk the battlefield where, in 1759, the French forces under General Montcalm were decisively trounced by the British, led by General Wolfe. The British took control of all of New France within a year of that 1759 battle, but even so French culture still lives on here in Québec City. More than 95 percent of Québec City's population speaks French as its first language, though it's easy to sightsee and navigate the city in English. (B, L, D)

DAY 6: Cruising Gulf of St. Lawrence

A lighthouse on little St. Paul's Island is a stark reminder of days gone by as you sail past this infamous old shipwreck site, known as the graveyard of the gulf, on your way through the Cabot Strait and into the Gulf of St. Lawrence. So huge is the gulf that half of Canada's 10 provinces have a coastal connection to it. Perhaps that's not surprising, considering that it's the world's largest estuary and fed all the way from the Great Lakes 1,200 kilometers (750 miles) away.(B,L,D)

DAY 7: Prince Edward Island

Charlottetown is the capital of Canada's smallest province, Prince Edward Island, as well as its largest city, though it has fewer than 35,000 residents. Despite its modest size, the city has an impressive number of Victorian houses and buildings and great parks waiting to be explored. Sites within downtown Charlottetown include the lovely Victoria Row, which becomes a pedestrian mall each summer, and other historic buildings, some of which are now museums. Nearby Prince Edward Island National Park is home to white-sand beaches and hiking and biking trails — plus fans can see the house and farm that inspired the beloved book Anne of Green Gables. (B,L,D)

DAY 8: Sydney, Nova Scotia

Sydney is the largest city on Cape Breton Island, which is linked by causeway to the rest of Nova Scotia. Sydney's attractions start at the harbor, where visitors can shop for locally made crafts and see the world's largest fiddle, which towers beside the port's cruise pavilion. Some of the city's historic houses and churches date back to the 1700s and 1800s and are open for tours. Restaurants often provide live music (expect fiddles and sea chanteys) along with meals of seafood fresh-caught in nearby waters. Sydney's galleries give visitors a chance to meet local artists and purchase their work. (B,L,D)

DAY 9: Halifax, Nova Scotia

Located on a rocky inlet on the Atlantic Ocean, Halifax — Nova Scotia's provincial capital — is defined by its maritime geography. It's a spirited mix of world-class history and nautical-themed museums alongside bunkers and fortresses that guarded the harbor, plus striking public art and sights, funky shops and excellent pubs serving up folk music (and good pints). Snap photos of attractions in the charming fishing village, Peggy's Cove, with its picturesque lighthouse on a rocky outcropping. Or wander the streets of Lunenburg, whose colorful Old Town is designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site. (B,L,D)

DAY 10: Bar Harbor, Maine

Located on Mount Desert Island in Maine, Bar Harbor is the quintessential New England coastal town. Picturesque and charming, it is a scenic and walkable town with streets lined with restaurants and boutiques. Dining on lobster is a must, as is a scoop or two at one of the town's homemade ice cream shops. Bar Harbor is surrounded by the magnificent Acadia National Park, making the area an adventurer's playground. The park, which is celebrating its centennial in 2016, is home to sites such as Cadillac Mountain, the tallest mountain along the eastern coast of the United States and the first place in the country to see the sun rise. (B,L,D)

Day 11: Boston, Mass

All too soon, your journey comes to an end. Disembark the ship and join your group transfer to the airport for your flight home. Or, extend your trip for a few more days to enjoy the historic city of Boston. (B)
